
EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Gangtok, capital of Sikkim, is located in the East District of the state. Gangtok's population is 1,00,286 (Census:2011) with a population density of 53 pph. The total area under Gangtok Municipal Corporation is about 19 Sq.Km. and constitutes of 17 municipal Wards. The Literacy rate of the male population is about 85.3%, while that of female population is about 78.7%. The nearest airport and nearest railway station connecting to the city is at Bagdogra (125 Kms) and New Jaipalguri (113 Kms) respectively.

Located in the eastern Himalayan range, Gangtok offers a unique charm to the tourists from all parts of the country and as well as from overseas. It experiences a mild temperate climate throughout the year.

Gangtok, is participating for the first time in the third round of Smart City Mission which was started in the year 2015. It is second city from the state of Sikkim to be in the Smart City Mission, first being Namchi which has already selected.

The Smart city proposal is formulated by considering the citizen and stake holder participation to the maximum extent. Citizen engagement has been carried out through various means including both offline and online. Numerous interactions were also conducted with urban planners, sector experts, and public representatives. Based on the feedback from the citizens, the requirements of the citizens has been analyzed and prioritized and incorporated the same in Smart city proposal. This helped in forming a citizen centric Smart City Proposal, benefitting all backgrounds of citizens. Considering all the above said feedbacks, the SWOT for the Gangtok city has been deprived as below



In an attempt to envelope the entire proposal under one, it was ensured that the Vision Statement reverts the SWOT outcomes and was in way with the existing city's vision. With much review and analysis, the City's Vision was formulated to be:

"To Promote Innovation Driven new age Economy by offering an enviable Quality of life and lifestyle options, in an ecologically responsible manner"

Identification and streamlining: Based on the Vision outlined, the strategic focus and blueprint was formulated as a way forward. The overall smart city plan was grouped under four focus areas, namely, **Liveable, Mobility, Cleanliness** and **Prosperous.** To achieve these focus areas, goals and sub-goals were identified to narrow down the projects such that they would translate the vision, address the issues and would harness on the strengths and opportunities to form strong linkages between citizens, stakeholders and partners. Briefly the focus areas include:

1. LIVEABLE

To facilitate the provision of infrastructure services, an underground Utility Duct has been proposed. Strengthening and Augmentation of existing physical infrastructure. A **SMART GRID** comprising of the public buildings is proposed which include **Rooftop Solar Panel PV**, **Rain Water Harvesting** and **Waste Water Treatment & Reuse**. It was observed that most of the citizens are concerned over lack of open spaces in the city, to overcome this issue landscaping of parks/green areas with public facilities is proposed to create lively open spaces. Smart City Knowledge Management Centre is being proposed to facilitate the SPV and incubation center for knowledge industries.

Strengthening and laying of water distribution network to the whole GMC jurisdiction area. Installation of smart metering in each individual water connection. Introduction of **SCADA** system to reduce the NRW losses, which in the current scenario is more than 50%. Gangtok Smart City Management System/Portal is proposed which would include a centralized backend command centre, enabling interdepartmental coordination for efficient governance (G2G & G2C). Capacity Building programs to ensure participation of the administration and its wings in an effective manner with smart city management system. This step will help achieve the intent of the portal.

2. MOBILITY

Multi-level smart parking solutions are proposed to decongest roads from un-regularized on-street parking, thereby improving vehicular movement, resulting in increase in travel speed, reduction in air pollution and fuel consumption. Upgradation of the connecting staircases with proper geometry and lighting system for easier mobility and safety at all times. Introduction of smart kiosk at various locations along the footpath for providing services to the commuters. Connecting skywalks is proposed to create connectivity to important activity centers for better mobility of the citizen. Features like CCTV Camera, Emergency call points and Modern Police Kiosks to ensure safety of citizens (children, women and elderly). LED based energy efficient street lighting to reduce energy consumption.

3. CLEANLINESS

The prime objective is to make the selected area "CLEAN' and continuing the city's pride achievement of "ZERO PERCENT OPEN DEFECATION" by facilitating efficient sewerage and solid waste management. It is proposed to strengthen and augment the existing sewer network, installation of roadside & community smart bins. These smart bins will be connected to a centralized monitoring system which will alert the responsible bodies whenever they are filled completely. Apart from the dust bin there is a proposal for waste recycling at local level by introduction of composting at local level. Procurement of automated road sweeping vehicles for easier cleaning of roads.

4. PROSPEROUS

Redevelopment and retrofitting of the STNM hospital, into an international heritage center/Library which also contains Auditorium, Semi Open-Air Theatre, cafeteria, Emergency trauma center, exhibition hall, and incubation center so as to retain the heritage of the structure as well as making it an active public space. Redevelopment of the Star Hall with facilities like kids play area, Food court, Gaming area and Movie Hall. In order to cater to the needs of citizens in terms of open spaces, the existing ridge park will be rejuvenated with modern facilities like pedestrian walkways, cycle track, Open gymnasium, children play equipment's, which will serve the purpose of centralized recreational space in the city. City branding will help promote these interventions resulting in a sense of belonging among citizens towards the city and its culture.

In the overall process it was ensured that each aspect was linked to another i.e. the citizen engagement and city profile driven SWOT formed the base for the strategic blueprint. Further based on which the Vision and goals were formulated in line with City's Vision and the Mission Guidelines and objectives. These Goals were then crystalized to formulate projects addressing concern of citizens and harnessing the strengths & opportunities to overcome weakness and threats.

Mainstreaming: To make the projects pragmatic and implementable vigorous citizen engagement and stakeholder consultation was conducted. The inventory of projects/programmes/schemes formulated during the city profiling helped in linking the projects to funds so as to ensure its viability. The convergence and risks were then analysed and addressed for each project. Further in discussion with stakeholder/line departments, projects were revised and revisited a number of times to gain their confidence and ensure their support for respective projects (MoU's). The projects are prioritized and linked in a seamless manner across duration of 5 years with detailed fund flow pattern covering all aspects. Based on the projects finalized partners and suppliers were approached for their opinion, feedback and support. These approaches ensured that the Smart City Proposal is inclusive and realistic.






INSTITUTIONAL ARRANGEMENT AND FOR OPERESANALISATION OF SPV

MINUTES OF THE HIGH POWERED STEERING COMMTTTE MEETING HELD ON 28th March 2017 IN THE CHAMBER OF THE CHIEF SECRETATY OF GOVERNMENT OF SIKKIM, CHAIRMAN, HSPC, SMART CITIES MISSION, GOVT. OF SIKKIM.

The meeting of the High Powered Steering Committee (HSPC) of the Smart Cities Mission was held on 28th March 2017 at 3.00 P.M. in the conference Hall of the Secretariat, Mannan Kendra, Development Area, Gangtok, Sikkim. The meeting was chaired by the Chief Secretary to the Govt. of Sikkim who is also the Chairman of the HSPC, Smart Cities Mission, Govt. Of Sikkim in order to review and approved the revised Smart City Proposal of the Gangtok Municipal Corporation (herein after shall be referred as GMC) which shall have to be submitted to the Ministry of Urban Development, Nirman Bhawan, New Delhi by the 31st of March 2017.

The list of attendees is enclosed in the Annexure appended herewith.

The Joint Chief Town Planner(S/W) who is the Nodal Officer (Smart Cities Mission-Sikkim) in his welcoming speech gave the brief outline of the Smart City Mission Guidelines and its statement. He further appraised the HSPC about as to how the mission like this will change the dynamics of urban growth and enhances the economy of the city as well that of the state. Its contribution to the conservation of ecosystem, protection of the environment through the adoption of clean and renewable energy, improvement in air quality, judicious use of scarce natural resources, the rationality in equitable distribution of environmental services etc. were also touched upon. Supplementing the introductory note, the Joint Chief Town Planner (S/W) Nodal Officer for the Smart City Mission-Sikkim appraised about the experiences about the preparation of SCP and lesson learnt while participating the All India City Challenge Competition for Namchi Smart City Proposal.

Furthermore, the Secretary, UD&HD who is also the State Mission Director, Smart Cities Mission-Sikkim appraised to the committee that M/s. Caritas Eco System Pvt. Ltd. In consortium with Data World India Pvt. Ltd have been assigned as the consultant to prepare the Smart City Proposal (SCP) for GMC and entered into the agreement on 1st of February 2017. The SCP is to be submitted to the MoUD by the 31st of March 2017 to enter into the challenge Round-III along with other 49 cities that were listed out to be developed under ROUND-III. He appealed the HSPC to review the revised SCP, which has already been approved by the GMC and informed the committee regarding the approaching dateline of 31st March 2017 for submission.

Mr.Akshat Jain, heading the consortium of the consultants namely M/s. Caritas Eco System Pvt. Ltd. & DataWorld India Pvt. Ltd made a presentation about the methodology opted in preparation of Smart City Proposal for Gangtok Municipal Corporation and explained about the salient features of the SCP of GMC.

The brief of the presentations was as under:

-Citizen Engagement through various modes to know the aspirations of the people viz. ward wise public consultation, Discussion with institutions, Schools and college students, Focus Group discussion with Traders Associations, Resident Welfare Associations, professionals Women Self Help Group routine & social media such as through **www.MyGov.in**, Facebook, twitter, Competitions such as Essay writing, Painting, Vision statement writing etc. under various categories, with using both online and offline platforms of internet.

-Selection of Area Based Development (ABD) proposal and Pan City Solution options through polling both online and offline. The sectors to be chosen were from the Green Field Development, Retrofitting and Redevelopment.

-The Pan City -Solutions of ICT based E-Governance and installation of SCADA centre using all the platform of Internet of things (IoT) and based on the principle of Crowdsourcing,M2M (machine to Machine), G2G, G2C, C2C Platform etc.

Further, he presented a comprehensive SCP of GMC that is proposed envisaging the GMC becoming the SMART CITY after achieving those milestones which had the components of all the features of Smart city with Smart solutions. Behind all the proposal, the Environmental sustainability was kept in the priority of which the citizens of GMC had also voiced their opinion.

Various components of the two Pan City Solutions of E-Governance & streamlining the existing Water Supply system through installation of smart meters and SCADA to enhance the efficiency of service level were appraised to the HSPC. This also aimed at the reduction in existing NRW (Non-Revenue Water) or UFW (Unaccounted for Water) simultaneously increase in efficiency in the collection of revenue for these services.

The financial plan of the SCP was also elaborated to the HPSC where different modalities of funding mechanism have been elaborated ranging from convergence of the other national flagship mission, PPP mode, external borrowings etc. Also the finance includes the one time Grant of the Government of India, State contribution for Smart Cities Mission for the total financial plan outlay.

The avenue to replicate the Area Based Development to other parts of the Municipal Corporation was also explained.

-After such detailed deliberations, the SLHPSC resolved the Smart City Proposal prepared and submitted by the consultant viz.M/s. Caritas Eco Services Pvt. Ltd in consortium with Data World India Pvt. Ltd. and UD&HD, GoS unanimously decided to forward the same to the Ministry of Urban Development, Nirman Bhawan, GoI, New Delhi. Further the members of the HSPC directed the Nodal Officer (Smart Cities Mission-Sikkim) personally to submit the Revised SCP of GMC to the Ministry of Urban Development, New Delhi within the prescribed timeline.

The meeting concluded with the vote of thanks by the nodal officer-Smart cities Mission (Sikkim).

RESOLUTION

The Gangtok Municipal Corporation (**GMC**) convened this meeting on the 27th March 2017 to discuss and deliberate on the various aspects for implementation of the Smart City Mission, initiated by the MoUD, Government of India with respect to Gangtok City, which is the city shortlisted to participate in the Round-III of the All India City Challenge Round under Smart Cities Mission.

It was resolved that a Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) by the name of **Gangtok Smart City Development Corporation Limited (GSCDCL)**, shall be incorporated as a Limited liability company under the Companies Act, 2013, with the main objective of developing **Gangtok City** into a **Smart City** for betterment of the quality of life of its people, through implementation of the Smart City Plan developed under the Smart City Challenge or as amended or redeveloped under the direction of a competent authority.

The SPV will function under the direction and control of the people of Gangtok represented by the Gangtok Municipal Corporation (GMC) and the State Government of Sikkim (GoS). The GMC and GoS shall hold equal number and value of shares and jointly hold a controlling stake in the SPV at all times.

The Board of Directors of the SPV shall consist of the following Directors as Board Members:

- 1. Director cum Chairperson: Secretary, UD&HD Government of Sikkim.
- 2. The Municipal Commissioner (MC) of Gangtok Municipal Corporation
- 3. In addition to the above, the Board of directors will include,
 - a. One nominee director of Central Government
 - b. Two nominee director of the GoS
 - c. One nominee director of GMC
 - d. 3 Independent Directors

The SPV GSCDCL shall be authorized and responsible for undertaking any or all activities including comprehensive urban & project planning, finance, implementation, operations, maintenance and management, etc. The SPV shall be a single point of contact and delivery for all essential urban infrastructure, utilities and services for the citizens of Gangtok and may function as the executive wing of the GMC.

The SPV being the aggregator of all urban services and utilities shall be delegated with the responsibility of tariff fixation for services GMC is mandated to provide under applicable laws, in consultation with the GMC. The SPV shall also be responsible for integrated billing, revenue collection from the citizens for such services or such taxes as may be delegated by the GMC or the GoS. All such revenue and taxes collected by the SPV shall be accounted and shared with GMC or the GoS after apportioning for any over or under recoveries and collection effort.

The detailed objectives, functions, responsibilities and constitution & composition of the SPV shall be defined in the Articles and Memorandum of Association (AoA & MoA) of the SPV. The GMC along with the GoS shall cause the aforementioned SPV to be incorporated soon after the results of the All India City Challenge are declared and before accessing or utilizing any funds specifically earmarked and released for the purpose of Smart City Gangtok under the Smart City Mission by the Government of India or the Government of Sikkim.

Therefore we the elected members of the Gangtok Municipal Corporation (GMC) sign this resolution on this day of 24th March 2017 and also approve/support the Smart City Proposal (SCP) prepared for the Gangtok City to be submitted for the All India City Challenge Competition under Smart Cities Mission, MoUD, GoI.

WHEREAS:

- A. Ministry of Urban Development, Government of India has launched Smart City Mission in 2015 with an objective is to promote cities that provide core infrastructure and give a decent quality of life to its citizens, a clean and sustainable environment and application of 'Smart' Solutions. The focus is on sustainable and inclusive development and the idea is to look at compact areas, create a replicable model, which will act like a lighthouse to other aspiring cities. The initiative intends to develop 100 cities and towns in the country as smart cities.
- B. Gangtok is one of the candidate cities for Smart City Mission from the state of Sikkim and is participating in the challenge round by submitting its Smart City Proposal. UDHD along with the GMC is the nodal agency for Smart City project and it shall be forming a Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) with State Government for planning, designing, financing, implementation, operation and maintenance of Smart City Projects. After incorporation of SPV, all rights and obligations of UDHD & GMC with regards to Smart City Projects shall be transferred to SPV.
- C. UDHD has progressed from small beginnings to embrace an overreaching authority in the development urban scenario of Sikkim as well as that of Gangtok. In consonance with the aspirations of modern India, UDHD aims at coordinated and planned development of this emerging city to enable Gangtok to achieve pride of place as the worthy and parallel urban centre to that of Gangtok, capital of state of Sikkim. Together with GMC, UDHD have been striving rapidly to provide basic urban infrastructure to absorb the pressures of a rapidly changing society, and to provide an environment that would enable the utmost satisfaction level of all sections of its inhabitants.
- D. UDHD on behalf of GMC and SHDB have been discussing the Gangtok Smart City Proposal including projects in the redevelopment of existing STNM Annexe building(s), Gangtok which is selected for redevelopment of mixed use encompassing all the modern amenities with the inclusiveness of all the sections of the societies under Area Based Development.

Now, pursuant to the ongoing discussions between the Parties, this MOU purports to summarize the principal terms of intended collaboration. This MOU records the preliminary understanding between them.

1. Purpose

The Purpose of this MOU is to define area of collaboration between UDHD/GMC and SHDB for planning, designing, financing, implementation, operation and maintenance of proposed Smart City Projects in Gangtok under Smart City Mission of Government of India.



2. Area of Collaboration

The area of collaboration between the Parties shall include only on Area Based Development and more specifically defined herein below:

FOR AREA BASED DEVELOPMENT includes but not limited to:-

- i) Commitment to promote mixed-use development project including housing Project on PPP basis.
- ii) Conduct techno-commercial feasibility
- iii) Provide institutional & technical support for identification of suitable PPP partner.
- iv) Financial supports in case of viability gap or else identify the suitable investment proponent to invest in the project identified under the Smart City Plan.

The Parties shall exchange necessary information required and jointly undertake the feasibility assessment, formulation of Smart City project etc. SHDB shall provide due support (physical, regulatory, administrative, manpower or otherwise) required for Smart City projects subject to availability on mutually acceptable terms. UDHD/GMC, being the nodal agency for Smart City Mission for Gangtok City, shall implement the Smart City projects through SPV. The Parties agree to congregate funds available to it for funding the smart city projects.

The Parties also agree that this MOU does not constitute legally binding commitment in respect of the possible partnership. Definitive agreement shall be subject to further negotiation between the Parties and the due diligence to be conducted by the Parties.

3. Non-exclusivity

The relationship of the Parties under this MOU shall be non-exclusive and both Parties shall be free to pursue other agreements or collaborations of any kind. However, when entering into a definitive agreement related to strategic area, the Parties may agree to limit each Party's right to collaborate with others on that subject.

4. Term and Termination

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9. Representation

Each Party hereby represents to the other that it has all necessary power and authority to execute and deliver this MOU.

10. Cooperation

UDHD/GMC and SHDB acknowledge that they have entered into this MOU in good faith and will cooperate in good faith to achieve the objectives set herein.

11. Liability

This MOU shall attract no liability whatsoever to either of the Parties.



12. Governing Law

This MOU will be governed and construed in accordance with the laws in force in India. The Parties hereby expressly consent to the jurisdiction of Courts in Gangtok, Sikkim for any lawsuit filed, arising from or related to this MOU.



THE SIKKIM ONLINE GAMING (REGULATION) AMENDMENT ACT, 2011 (ACT NO. 20 OF 2011)

AN ACT

further to amend the Sikkim Online Gaming (Regulation) Act, 2008 (23 of 2008).

BE it enacted by the Legislature of Sikkim in the Sixty–second Year of the Republic of India as follows:-

Short title and Commencement

- 1. (1) This Act may be called the Sikkim Online Gaming (Regulation) Amendment Act, 2011.
 - (2) It shall come into force at once.

Amendment of section 2.

2. In the Sikkim Online Gaming (Regulation) Act, 2008 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act), in section 2, after clause (b), the following clause shall be inserted, namely:-

"(bb) "Authority" means and includes such body consisting of such officials both technical as well as administrative and legal as may be constituted by the State Government."

Insertion of section 12 A after section 12.

3. In the principal Act, after section 12, the following section shall be inserted, namely:-

"12 A. Appeal against order of the Authorized Officer.

- (1) Any person aggrieved by an order of the authorized officer may prefer an appeal to such officer not below the rank of Secretary to the State Government as the State Government may by notification appoint under clause (b) of section 2.
- (2) Subject to the provisions of sections 4 to 9 and 12, an appeal shall lie from every order of the Authorized Officer under the Act to the Appellate Authority appointed by the Government under sub section (1).
- (3) Every such appeal shall be preferred within 60 (sixty) days from the date of communication of the order.
- (4) The appellant shall have a right to appear through a counsel and the Authorized Officer and Department may be represented by such officer or person or a counsel as the Government may appoint.
- (5) On the receipt of any such appeal, the Appellate Authority shall give the appellant and respondent a reasonable opportunity of being heard and after making such inquiry as it deems proper, dispose of the appeal for reason to be recorded.
- (6) The proceeding before the Appellate Authority shall be completed within four months of its institution."

Insertion of section 12 B

4. In the principal Act, after section 12 A, the following section shall be inserted, namely:-

"12 B. Authority for overseeing online gaming etc.

The Authority constituted by the State Government under clause (bb) of section 2 shall oversee and regulate the functions of gaming Organizations/Companies involved in on-line games and sports."

- (d) in clause (l), for the letter and word "a lottery", the words "an on-line gaming or Sport Gaming" shall be substituted;
- (e) after clause (n), the following clause shall be added, namely:-"(na) " prescribed" means prescribed by rules made under this Act;"

Amendment of 3. In sub-section (1) of section 5 of the principal Act, Section 5. for the words "Tourism Department", the words "Finance, Revenue and Expenditure Department" shall be substituted.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 23 of the Sikkim On-line Gaming (Regulation) Act, 2008 (23 of 2008), the State Government hereby makes the following rules further to amend the Sikkim On-line Gaming (Regulation) Rules, 2009, namely:-

- 1. (1) These rules may be called the Sikkim On-line Gaming (Regulation) Amendment Rules, 2010.
- (2) They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.
- 2. In the Sikkim On-line Gaming (Regulation) Rules, 2009 (hereinafter referred to as the said rules), in clause (g) of rule 2, for the word "timing", the word "time being" shall be substituted;
- 3. In the said rules, for the existing sub-rule (1) of rule 5, the following sub-rule shall be substituted, namely:-
- "Issue of licence for On-line games and the sports games:- (1) On receipt of an application under rule 4, the Government shall examine the application and after making such inquiry as it considers necessary, may grant a provisional licence in Form-2 on payment of a fee of one lakh rupees to enable the licensee to set up the necessary infrastructure and other requirements so as to be in a position to commence operation of on-line games and the sports games and thereafter, on the satisfaction of the Government that the applicant is fully ready to commence operations of online gaming and sports gaming activity and has complied with the stipulations prescribed in the said provisional licence and such other terms and conditions prescribed in the Act and Rules, the Government may grant a regular licence for operation of on-line games and sports games in Form-2A for five years on payment of a fee of five lakh rupees. "
- 4. In the said rules, in sub-rule (2) of rule 8, the existing clauses (g), (h) and (i) shall be renumbered as (a), (b) and (c) respectively;
- 5. In the said rules, in sub-rule (1) of rule 10, for the word and figure "rule 8", the word and figure "rule 9" shall be substituted.

- 6. In the said rules, in rule 11, for the words and figures "rules 8 or 9", the words and figures "rules 9 or 10" shall be substituted.
- 7. In the said rules, in sub-rule (2) of rule 12, for the word and figure "rule 5", the word and figure "rule 6" shall be substituted.
- 8. In the said rules, in Form 1, in the fourth paragraph, for the word and figure "rule 5", the word and figure "rule 6" shall be substituted.
- 9. In the said rules, in Form 3, in the heading, for the words, figures and brackets "(See sub-rule (2) of rule 5)", the words, figures and brackets "(See sub-rule (2) of rule 6)" shall be substituted.
- 10. In the said rules, in the Schedule :-
 - (a) in the heading, for the words, figures and brackets "(See sub-rule (1) of rule 8)", the words, figures and brackets "(See sub-rule (1) of rule 9)" shall be substituted;
 - (b) in paragraph 1;
 - (i) the existing clauses (c), (d), (e) and (f) shall be renumbered as (a), (b),

(c) and (d) respectively;

- (ii) in the existing clause (c), the word "or" shall be deleted:
- (iii) in the existing clause (d), for the word "Commissioners", the word "Government" shall be substituted.

5. The licensee should make available only the games specified under rule 3 of the Sikkim Online Gaming (Regulation) Rules, 2009. If the licensee intends to include new games, prior approval of the Government must be obtained.
The Licensee shall allow any Officer authorized by the Government to inspect the setup process or inspect premises from where the On-Line games are to be operated.
7. The Provisional licence is valid for 120 days from the date of issue and immediately on the licensee intimating in writing to the Government that it is ready to commence actual online gaming and sports gaming operations, i.e., 'go live' and on such determination by the State Government that the applicant licensee has complied with the stipulations prescribed hereinabove and such other terms and conditions prescribed in the Act and Rules, the licensee may be granted a regular license for a period of five years on payment of fees of five lakhs rupees as provided under the Rules.
8. The Licensee shall pay to the Government a sum of one lakh rupees as Provisional License fee through a Bank Draft in favour of the Director, Sikkim State Lotteries, and submit the same before issue of the said licence.

NOTIFICATION

In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-rule (1) of rule 6 of the Sikkim On-line Gaming (Regulation) Rules, 2009, the State Government hereby notifies that the online gaming and sports gaming levy shall be payable by the licensee to the State Government at the rate of 10(ten) percent of the gross gaming yield or 5 (five) crore rupees, whichever is higher.

- 2. The above levy rate will be applicable for a period of 1 (one) year with effect from date of issue of this Notification and will be subject to review and revision by the State Government from time to time as prescribed under the rules.
- 3. It is clarified that the minimum assured revenue payable to the Government is 5 (five) crore rupees per annum. While calculating the gross gaming yield due attention is drawn to sub-section (1) of section 10 of the Sikkim On-line Gaming (Regulations) Act, 2008 which stipulates that all promotional or free bets or stakes shall be excluded, i.e. not taken into account and also to sub-section (3) of section 10 of the said Act which stipulates the inclusion of gross gaming yield of such person/company as mentioned in the said sub-section.

The Sikkim Online Gaming (Regulation) Rules, 2009

The Sikkim Online Gaming (Regulation) Act, 2008 has provided a legal framework for online gaming in India. This is a revolutionary piece of legislations as it has tried that not other State has been able to achieve. The 2008 Act has been notified (PDF) and it is now operational in the State of Sikkim. Even an authorised officer (PDF) has been appointed under the 2008 Act by the Sikkim Government.

In order to make the provisions of 2008 Act operational, the Sikkim Online Gaming (Regulation) Rules, 2009 (PDF) were formulated. Perry4Law and Perry4Law's Techno Legal Base (PTLB) are discussing the provisions of the Rules 2009 for the larger benefit of all stakeholders.

Rule 2 (b) of the Rules 2009 provides that "advertisement" includes every form of advertising or promotion, whether by means of the Internet, in a radio or television programme or message (whether broadcast or not), in a written or printed publication, by the display of notices, signs, labels or showcards, by means of circulars or other documents or through any other medium.

Rule 2(e) of the Rules 2009 provides that "OGS" means a computer or system or systems of computers by means of which online gaming is conducted, (including but not limited to equipment or disseminating or distributing a result, or part of a result or determining a winning player) in relation to or used in connection with, online gaming as well as;

- (i) All its associated components, and
- (ii) Its operating systems and applications software.

Rule 2(f) of the Rules 2009 provides that "operator" in relation to any On-line game, means the person by whom it is conducted.

Rule 2(g) of the Rules 2009 provides that "person" includes a Partnership Firm or Company registered in accordance with the provisions of the law relating to the registration of such Partnership Firm or Company as the case may be, for the time being in force in the State.

Rule 2(h) of the Rules 2009 provides that "player" means in relation to an online gaming a person participating in on-line game with the operator, or the overseas licensed operator

Rule 2(j) of the Rules 2009 provides that "website" means an electronic communication or set of electronic communications which complies with the Hyper Text Transfer Protocol and may be accessed and viewed in visible and legible form by any person having ordinary access to the global systems of inter communicating computers known as the Internet.

Rule 3 of the Rules 2009 provides that the games of (i) Roulette, (ii) Black Jack, (iii) Pontoon, (iv) Punto Banco, (v) Bingo, (vi) Casino Brag, (vii) Poker, (viii) Poker Dice, (ix) Baccarat, (x) Chemin-de-for, (xi) Backgammon, (xii) Keno, (xiii) Super Pan 9 may be played online in the manner provided under these Rules.

Rule 4 of the Rules 2009 provides that every person interested to operate online games specified in Rule 3, shall make an application to the Government in Form I accompanied by a Bank Receipt for five hundred rupees as application fee.

Rule 5(1) of the Rules 2009 provides that on receipt of an application under rule 4, the Government shall examine the application and after making such inquiry as it considers necessary, may grant a provisional licence in Form-2 on payment of a fee of one lakh rupees to enable the licensee to set up the necessary infrastructure and other requirements so as to be in a position to commence operation of on-line games and the sports games and thereafter, on the satisfaction of the Government that the applicant is fully ready to commence operations of online gaming and sports gaming activity and has complied with the stipulations prescribed in the said provisional licence and such other terms and conditions prescribed in the Act and Rules, the Government may grant a regular licence for operation of online games and sports games in Form-2A for five years on payment of a fee of five lakh rupees.

Rule 5(2) of the Rules 2009 provides that the license granted under sub-rule (1) shall be valid for a period of one year which may be renewed for a further period of one year on payment of a renewal fee of one lakh rupees.

Rule 6(1) of the Rules 2009 provides that the licensee shall pay to the Government an Online Gaming levy at the rate of one percent (1%) of the gross gaming yield. Rule 6(2) of the Rules 2009 provides that the online gaming levy for the proceeding month shall be paid by the licensee by the fifteenth day of every following month duly filling the details in the statement in Form-3 failing which a penalty equivalent to one-fifth of the levy will be charged on the licensee. Rule 6(3) of the Rules 2009 provides that a licensee shall be required to execute a Bank Guarantee of five crore rupees in favour of the Government as security deposit every year at the time of the issue and renewal of the license. On expiry of the period of one year, the licensee shall have to give a fresh Bank Guarantee of an equal amount to the Government.

Rule 7 of the Rules 2009 provides that every licensee shall, in relation to any online game, maintain a website the front or home page of which shall contain the following, namely:

- (a) Its full name and address of its registered office,
- (b) The number of license under which the online game is conducted,

(vi) If it make any claim as to the potential payout of a game, it shall contain sufficient information to enable a person to determine readily and easily the expected percentage return to him over a period of time, disregarding any exercise of skill by him.

Rule 8(4) of the Rules 2009 provides that if it appears to the Government that any advertisement of online game does not comply with sub-rule (2) or (3) they may direct the operator either:

- (i) To stop the advertisement being published or shown, or
- (b) To take such steps as they may specify to change the advertisement to comply with sub rules (2) or (3) as the case may be.

Rule 8(5) of the Rules 2009 provides that a direction under sub-rule (4) shall be in writing and state the grounds on which it is given and the time within which it must be complied with.

Rule 8(6) of the Rules 2009 provides that if any requirement of sub-rule (2) or (3) is contravened, or if a direction under sub-rule (4) is not complied with, each of the following:

- (i) The Licensee and
- (b) The person who is the designated official in relation to the licensee is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding five thousand rupees.

Rule 9(1) of the Rules 2009 provides that a licensee or the operator acting on his behalf shall, before any online gaming is conducted by means of any OGS, produce to the Government a certificate in writing issued by a person approved for the purpose by the Government that the OGS by means of which it is conducted complies with the standards specified in the Schedule.

Rule 9(2) of the Rules 2009 provides that the obligation under sub-rule (1) arises:

- (a) Prior to the licensee or the operator permitting the OGS to be accessed by any player for the placing of wagers; and
- (b) On or before the expiry of the periods specified in the license.

Rule 9(3) of the Rules 2009 provides that sub-rule (1) will not apply in so far as the licensee or the operator intending to use the OGS produces to the Government a certificate in writing issued by a person approved for the purpose by the Government (prior to the OGS being accessed by players directly or indirectly for the purpose of placing wagers) that the OGS is not different in any material, technical or operational respect to an OGS already certified as being fully compliant with the Schedule for and on behalf of another operator under sub-rule (1).

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- (c) The date on which the license was originally granted,
- (d) A statement that the online game is regulated in Sikkim State,
- (e) Hyperlink to the websites of the Government and players Anonymous,
- (f) One or more hyperlinks to a page or pages setting out:
- (i) A summary of the arrangements for registration,
- (ii) A statement that persons under the age of eighteen years are not permitted to register or to participate in the game,
- (iii) A statement that online game debts are enforceable in law in Sikkim.

Rule 8(1) of the Rules 2009 provides that every advertisement of online game shall contain URL of or in the case of an advertisement on a website, a hyperlink to the website maintained under Rule 6.

Rule 8(2) of the Rules 2009 provides that every advertisement of online game shall comply with the following general requirements, namely.-

- (i) It shall not be indecent or offensive,
- (ii) It shall be based on facts, and
- (i) It shall not be false, deceptive or misleading in any material particular.

Rule 8(3) of the Rules 2009 provides that without prejudice to sub-rule (2), every advertisement of online game shall comply with the following requirements, namely:

- (i) It shall not contain any Statement as to the legality or otherwise of online game betting in any other jurisdiction,
- (ii) It shall not be directed at any jurisdiction in which online game or any kind of online game is prohibited,
- (iii) It shall not have any sexual content,
- (iv) It shall not be directed at person under eighteens years of age,
- (v) It shall not contain any material in breach of copyright,

- (C). The game outcome must not be affected by the effective bandwidth, link utilization, bit error rate or other characteristic of the communications channel between the OGS and the computer or other device used by the player.
- (D). The OGS must be able to display for each game the following information (i.e. on the current page or on a page directly accessible from the current page via a hyperlink):
- (a) The name and rules of the game,
- (b) Restrictions on play,
- (c) Instructions on how to play, including a pay-table for all prizes and special features,
- (d) The player's' current account balance and currency or currencies utilized to place wagers,
- (e) Unit and total wagers permitted,
- (f) The return to the player, or sufficient information to enable a player to determine readily and easily the expected return to him in relation to any game, disregarding any exercise of skill by him, and
- (g) For the specified periods in which the tests take place, the percentage of total wagers returned to players in relation to all house games offered by the operator.
- (3) Reporting Requirements: (A). All financial reports produced by the OGS must be readily reconcilable with gaming transaction reports, and all such reports shall be freely available to the Government.
- (B). The OGS must:
- (i) Be capable of producing monthly auditable and aggregated financial statements of gaming transactions, and
- (ii) Calculate accurately the levy and other dues to the Government.
- (C). The OGS must maintain information about all game played, including:
- (i) The identify of the player,
- (ii) The time the game began,
- (iii) The balance on the player's' account at the start of the game,

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- (iv) The wagers placed in the game (timestamped),
- (v) The game status (in progress, complete, etc.),
- (vi) The result of the game (timestamped),
- (vii) The time the game ended,
- (viii) Amount won or lost by the player,
- (ix) The balance on the player's account at the end of the game, and
- (x) The currency or currencies utilized by the player.
- (D). The OGS must maintain information about significant events as follows:
- (i) Large wins (as agreed by the Government from time to time),
- (ii) Transfers of funds (between players or between any player and the licensee) in excess of such amount as the Government may from time to time direct by notice in writing to the licensee.
- (iii) Material changes made by the licensee to game returns, disclosed under paragraph 6(f) above, and
- (iv) Material fluctuations in theoretical/estimated statistical return to players (being a percentage of lost players` 'wagers agreed with the Government from time to time).

Rule 10(1) of the Rules 2009 provides that the OGS by means of which any online gaming is conducted may not without the prior approval of the Government or the officer authorized by the Government in this behalf be altered in any way which is likely to affect its compliance with the requirements of the Schedule, subject to sub-rule (2) of rule 8. Rule 10(2) of the Rules 2009 provides that sub-rule (1) will not apply to each new game launched by the Licensee provided that nothing in this rule will obviate the requirements that the OGS continues to comply fully with the Schedule.

Rule 11 of the Rules 2009 provides that if any requirement of Rules 8 or 9 is contravened, the licensee or the operator, as the case may be, shall on conviction, be punishable with a fine which may extend to five thousand rupees.

Rule 12(1) of the Rules 2009 provides that every licensee shall maintain the accounts of the all online games showing the details of the Gross Gaming yield and the levy payable to the Government in a register as may be specified for the purpose by the Government. Rule 12(2) of the Rules 2009 provides that every licensee shall submit to Government a statement of gross Gaming yield and levy payable to Government every month in Form 3 as prescribed under sub-rule (2) of rule 5.

Rule 13(1) of the Rules 2009 provides that no licensee or his operator shall allow or admit or register person below the age of eighteen years to play on-line games specified in these rules. Rule 13(2) of the Rules 2009 provides that if any licensee is found contravening the provision of sub-rule (1) he shall be punished with a fine not exceeding one thousand rupees.

Rule 14 of the Rules 2009 provides that if the holder of a license or any person acting on his behalf commits a breach of any of the conditions of the license under section 12 of the Act, he shall, on conviction, be punished with a fine which may extend to ten thousand rupees.

Rule 15 of the Rules 2009 provides that if any person liable under section 13 to keep accounts or to submit statement of accounts fails to keep accounts or to submit statement of accounts as required by that section or keeps accounts or submits statement of account which are false and which he either knows or believes to be false or does not believe to be true, he shall, on conviction, be punished with a fine which may extend to ten thousand rupees.

Rule 16 of the Rules 2009 provides that if any person other than the licensee while playing online game at the approved website licensed under the Act commits a breach of any of the conditions of the license as exhibited, or of the rules to be observed in playing such games, he shall, on conviction, be punished with a fine which may extend to five thousand rupees.

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Rule 17 of the Rules 2009 provides that if any question arises as to the interpretation of any of these rules, the matter shall be referred to the Government and the decision of the Government thereon shall be final.

The Schedule to the rules 2009 prescribes the requirements with which OGS must comply with. These requirements are as follows:

- (1) General: (A). The OGS must -
- (i) Follow the game rules published to the player or prior to its placing any wagers,
- (ii) Provide over specified periods no more than the house advantage agreed by the Commissioners with the operator, and
- (iii) Integrate contingencies for loss of continuity of play, and
- (iv) if utilized in any peer to peer game, ensure that over the specified periods that no one player has any advantage over any other player playing the same game.
- (B). Both the gaming and financial transactions software must be congruent and secure.
- (2) Randomness: (A) (1) The OGS must satisfy the following criteria for randomness for any gaming, namely:
- (a) The data must be randomly generated, passing appropriate statistical non static output results tests of randomness (e.g., Marsaglia's` "Diehard" set of tests) uniformly distributed over the set range,
- (b) The data must be unpredictable, i.e. it must not be computationally feasible to predict what the next number will be, given complete knowledge of the algorithm or hardware generating the sequence, and all previously generated numbers, and
- (c) The series cannot reliably be reproduced, i.e. if the sequence generator is activated again with the same input (as exactly as humanly possible) it will produce two completely unrelated random sequences.
- (A) (2) The licensee must disclose the methodology of any random seeding and any seeding must be proven to result in an unpredictable output.
- (B). The outcome of any game, and the return of the player, must be independent of the CPU, memory, disk or other components used in the computer or other device used by the player.
